WACO IS THE HAPPENING PLACE WITH FUN APRIL EVENTS

WACO, Texas- The Waco Convention & Visitors Bureau announces that Waco will be the host to many events taking place in April, including the Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma Southwest District Conference, April 9-11 at the Waco Convention Center and Baylor University; the Cotton Palace Pageant, April 22-23 at the Waco Convention Center; and the Super Series Baseball 2010 Super Series Baseball Tournaments, April 10-11 at Riverbend Ballpark.

Taking place at Baylor University is the Baptist General Convention of Texas – Hispanic Evangelism Annual Hispanic Youth Congreso, April 1-3; the Baylor Department of Statistical Science’s Annual Conference of Texas Statisticians, April 9-10; Baylor Spring Premiere, April 17; the Association of Directors of Missions, April 18-19; and the Baylor Management Communication Association’s MBA Annual Conference, April 22-25.

The Heart of Texas Fair Complex will host the Baylor Varsity Equestrian National Championship, April 15-18; the Texas Quarter Horse Association’s event April 20-25; the Western Festival and Expo, April 29-May 2; and the Cross Timbers & Texas Paint Horse Club, April 30-May 2.

Other events being held in Waco include Spring Farm Day on April 10 at the World Hunger Relief Farm; the Texas Leadership Institute Seminar on April 23 at the Greater Waco Chamber of Commerce;

the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure event taking place April 24 at Indian Spring Park; and the Chi Eta Phi Nursing District Mid South Region Conference, April 29-May 2 at the Hilton.
