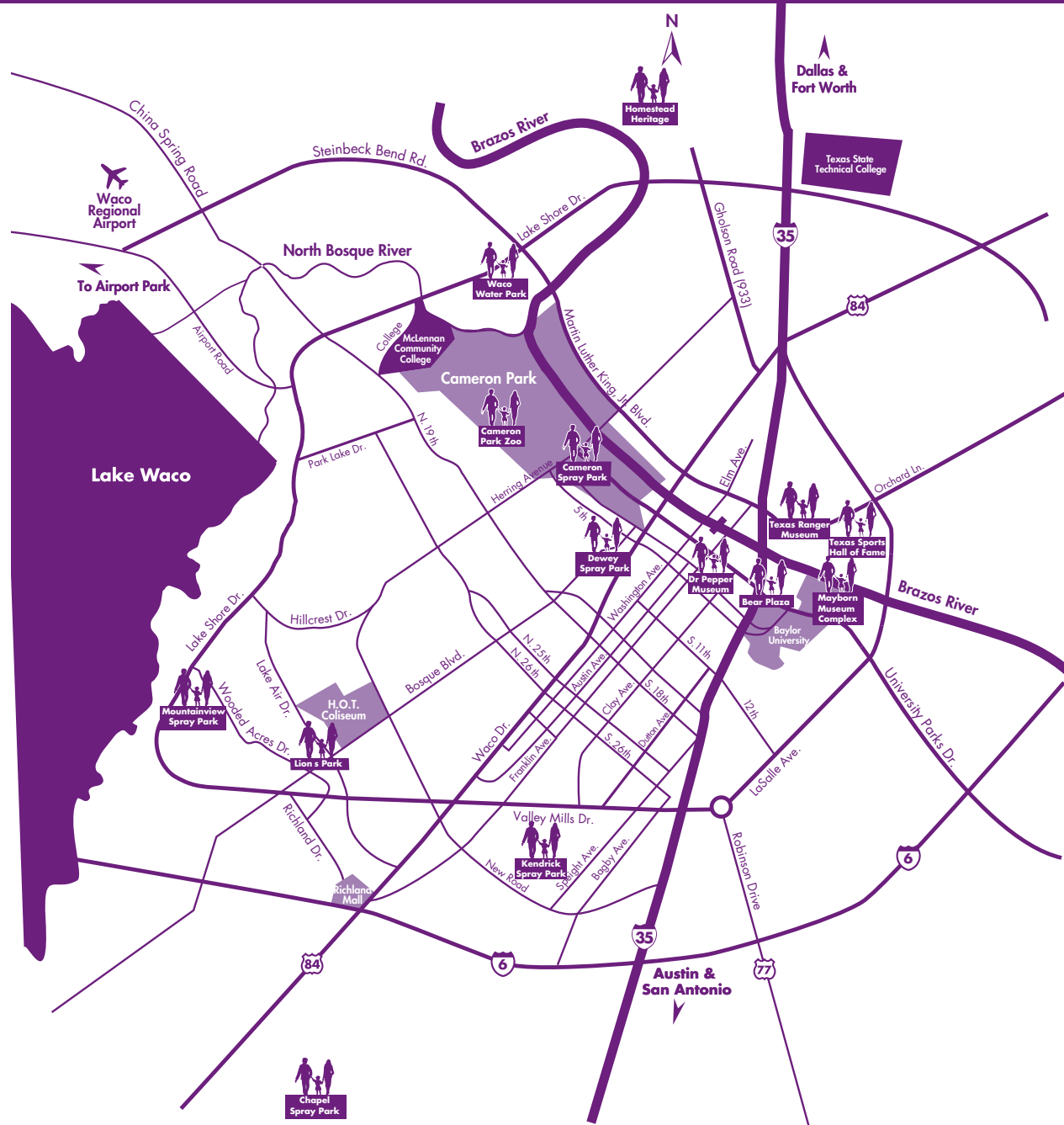

### Cameron Park Zoo

1701 N. 4th St.  
Tour Time: app. 2 hours

There is always something fun happening at the Cameron Park Zoo! From the comical antics of the Gibbon apes to the exciting Brazos River Country exhibit, families will stay

entertained for hours.

### Dr Pepper Museum

300 S. 5th St.  
Tour Time: app. 1-1/2 hours for tour and 1/2 hour to enjoy the old-fashion soda fountain.

See a replica of the drug store where Dr Pepper was invented as well as an animatron of pharmacist Dr Charles Alderton telling the story of its invention. The interactive exhibits, which are designed for younger audiences are fun and educational. The "What's your favorite soft drink?" exhibit is great fun for all ages!



### Texas Ranger Hall of Fame & Museum

I-35 at University Parks Dr.  
Tour Time: app. 1-1/2 hours for self-paced tour

At the museum you will see six rooms of exhibits that tell the colorful story of the history of these legendary lawmen. If you have



time, catch the video presentation on the history of the Texas Rangers.

### Mayborn Museum Complex

Tour Time: app. 2 to 2-1/2 hours

Kids of all ages will find something fun to do at the Mayborn Museum Complex. The sixteen themed discovery rooms allow kids to try on clothing from around the world, scrape skins and grind corn like Native Americans, stand inside a beating heart, or work on science experiments.



### Spray Parks

Five neighborhood Spray Parks are located throughout Waco. Cameron Park, Kendrick Park, Chapel Park, Dewey Park and Mountainview Park offer a wet splash to anyone willing to press the "water" button. The parks are free and open during daylight hours.



### Texas Sports Hall of Fame

Tour Time: app. 1-1/2 hours

The Texas Sports Hall of Fame is a great place to learn about a favorite team or player. The interactive displays give visitors a chance to match stride, height, hand and shoe size to those of an average NBA player. Answers to a sports trivia quiz can be found throughout the Hall of Fame. This is one quiz kids will love!



### Lion's Park
